- Acted as Focal Partner for the Health Partners Group, one of the largest Sector Wide Approach (SWAp) in the world, representing all health partners in high level dialogue with Ministry of Health and other Government Officials

THE WORLD BANK Senior Health Specialist 2005-2010 Washington, USA

- Led the development of the Afghanistan's "Health Sector Emergency and Reconstruction Project" (USD 100 million) to provide basic health care services to approximately 15 million Afghans in rural areas through contracting of NGOs
- Supervised the implementation of the Afghanistan "HIV-AIDS Prevention Project" (USD 10 million), the first ever project on HIV/AIDS in Afghanistan. The project focused primarily on at risk groups (drug users, prisoners and sex workers)
- Contributed to the establishment of the first SWAp in the health sector in Afghanistan, merging the financing of EC, USAID, World Bank and Afghanistan Reconstruction Trust Fund in one single platform for health
- Supervised the implementation of the India "Second National Tuberculosis Project" (USD 170 Million). The project supported the largest TB program in the world, which provided treatment to approximately 1.2 million people per year
- Published a study on the impact of aid to the health sector in Somalia over the period 2000-2010. The study prompted increased financing in the area of maternal and reproductive health which had been severely underfunded over the period 2000-2010
